Reminder—No Vehicles in the Parking Lot

Please respect these rules and park on the street and walk your children to their designated areas.



Volunteering in our Schools

There are many ways to contribute to your child's education and school community. Volunteering is a great way to stay connected. We value the contribution of all our volunteers and appreciate their time spent supporting our students, staff and Catholic education. Requirements to volunteer:

- A Vulnerable Sector Police Check/Criminal Background Check (CBC)
- Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (A.O.D.A.)

CBC—a form obtained at the school is taken to your local police station and a search, based on the information provided, is performed by the police (can also apply online with the police). Volunteers must have a Vulnerable Sector Police Check every 3 years.

Arrival Time at School

Educators have long understood the connection between good attendance, punctuality, and academic success. Frequent absences, and late arrivals, even when justified, make effective



instruction and assessment difficult for teachers and comprise learning for students. We remind all parents that the bell to begin our day rings at 8:45 am and instruction begins promptly after the children enter the classroom. Late arrivals disrupt the learning environment for all students, cause the teacher to restart instruction and necessitates repeated review of concepts. We ask that all families do their part to ensure our students are arriving promptly and ready to begin their instructional day on time. We thank you for your anticipated cooperation.
